


Honorary Coach . . . Ruben!

ARCA employees are dedicated to providing people with intellectual and developmental disabilities opportunities to live great lives! ARCA is passionate about recruiting the best staff and hire only the top 10% of applicants. Applicants go through a rigorous screening process which includes attending a one-hour informational session, interview, criminal background check, employment verifications, reference checks, drug testing and an intensive two-week paid, training program.

Recently, ARCA's Training Department added a new level of staff support. Senior Trainers Crystal Cantu and Christy Pina are mentoring and coaching staff at their individual work locations. Not only does this free up house Managers to perform their other duties, but the results with staff have been fantastic.

Typically, a Program Manager will ask Crystal or Christy to address a specific training issue at one of their homes. Coaches work with staff by providing customized training on teamwork, medication delivery, improved communication skills and other topics the Manager has identified. The Program Managers and staff appreciate the help and quickly see the home performing more effectively.

This support enhances the workplace experience for staff while creating new opportunities for individuals in our care. Thank you Crystal and Christy!


